A non-technical summary of the project

OffgridSun Srl and Pamodzi Ndi Ana are implementing Safe Water Access Project in Chipangali, located in Eastern Province in Zambia. Main objective of the project is to improve the livelihoods of about 20.000 people living in Chipangali District by providing sufficient, affordable and clean drinking water to targeted communities within

reasonable proximity and using purification technologies that are safe for the environment thus reducing the carbon emissions.

According to the data collected by the Zambia Demographic and Health Survey (DSH 2018), only 58 % of rural household access to basic drinking water services while 42% of population rely on unimproved water sources, such as ponds, shallow wells, surface water such lakes and rivers Moreover, 78% of Zambians living in rural areas lack access to basic sanitation services because of the lack of water and proper piped water infrastructures.

The main reasons for the limited access of rural households to safe water are related either to low availability of boreholes, or to the low efficiency of the existing boreholes due to lack of maintenance. These communities therefore either drink the unsafe water exposing themselves to water borne diseases or boil water. Limited access to safe drinking water contributes to childhood illness, malnutrition, and elevated school drop-out rates for adolescent girls, amongst other issues. Those who boil the water uses firewood and charcoal which accelerates deforestation problems and cuase greenhouse gas emissions.

In order to overcome those challenges, Chipangali Safe Water Access Project will rehabilitate the existing boreholes not functioning from at least three months and establish new hand pumped boreholes. The project will deploy zero-emission technology to treat and supply safe drinking water in accordance with the technologies available on the ground and indicated by the Government. The project will positively impact on the environment since the greenhouse gas emissions derived from boiling unsafe drinking water will be avoided by making safe water accessible to local population.

Timeline:

The rehabilitation of existing boreholes and establishment of new hand pumped boreholes in Chipangali are planned to start in May 2022.








Summary of economic, social and environmental impacts of the Project

Environmental impacts		Access to clean water and sanitation: 42% of rural population in Zambia use water from unimproved water sources, such as ponds, shallow wells, surface water such lakes and rivers. Also, 78% of rural population lack access to basic sanitation services. Through rehabilitation of existing boreholes and establishment of new hand pumped boreholes, safe and affordable drinking water will be made accessible to local population.
		Reduction of CO2 emissions: Through rehabilitation of existing boreholes and establishment of new hand pumped boreholes, safe water will be made accessible to local population. This will reduce GHGs emissions from boiling unsafe water. Also, the project will deploy zero-emission technology to treat and supply safe drinking water in accordance with the technologies available on the ground and indicated by the Government.
		Reduced deforestation: Firewood is the main source of energy for boiling the untreated water. Most of the rural households in the area depend more on the forest for their biomass fuels, causing deforestation problems. When accessing safe water, there will be no need to boil unsafe water. This will have positive impact on forest degradation and deforestation related to firewood consumption for boiling purposes in the region.
Social impacts		Improved health conditions: Population in the project region do not have access to water within reasonable reach and the water quality does comply with drinking water quality standards. Therefore, they inevitably expose to water borne diseases.
		Empowerment of women: With less time spent on fuel wood collection, the risk of gender-based violence will also reduce. Furthermore, women will have more time available for leisure, education or opportunities for market employment that can raise their household status.
		Creating jobs: Rehabilitation of existing boreholes and establishment of new hand pumped boreholes, and maintenance activities will create temporary and permanent job opportunities for local people. The employees will acquire new skills and knowledge through trainings provided as well.

Minutes of physical meeting(s)

The meeting took place in Saint Margaret Girl Secondary School Hall on February 8th 2022 and 44 participants attended.

The meeting opened by welcoming all participants and explaining the aim of the meeting. The Chairperson of the Chipanagali District Council (Mr Maxwell Mwale) introduced the Local Authorities and the Traditional Chiefs present and after that, all the people introduced themselves. The representatives of the project partners also introduced themselves and their roles in the project shortly. PNA Managing Director (Mr Enrico Carretta) explained the purpose of the meeting and the main aim of the collaboration with OffGridsun.

The District Commissioner (Mr Paul Sakala) emphasized the importance of the meeting as an opportunity for Chiapangli District to improve the water and sanitation needs, and Cheif Chanje emphasizes the lack of access to clean water for the people as a major problem of the area and a limitation to development.

All presentations and discussions were interpreted in local language and vice versa by project representatives.

The first presentation was done by PNA Managing Director who explained general and specific objectives of the project and introduced the project partners in detail. He further gave details of project implementation including the project's contest, objective, strategy, tentative schedule, and foreseen positive impacts.

The following questions were asked from the public and answers given by PNA Managing Director to the presentation.

Question1: The Council Chairperson said that the new government policy is for schools and communities to slowly stop using hand pumps and pit latrines and to start using piped water systems and flushing toilettes. As OffgridSun is a company dealing also with a solar system, he asked if it is possible to combine the knowledge they have to have tap water in the schools of Chipangali District.

Answer: At the moment the project will focus on communities and is not foreseen the use of PV systems to power the pumps and water system in schools.

Question 2: Will the community be charged for the new borehole?

Answer: The communities will not be charged for drilling boreholes or repairing them.

Question 3: A member of the public asked the reason why the government (Chipanagli Council) is charging communities 1.500 ZW for drilling a new borehole and 800 ZW for rehabilitation of an existing one?

Answer: The Council Chairperson answered that the community contribution requested was decided by the government, and said charges do not reflect the actual cost for drilling a new borehole and the materials, which for now is around 20.000/25.000 ZW. This fee must be paid either if the borehole is drilled by the community or by an NGO. The fee also helps to engage the community before requesting the borehole and encourage ownership of the same. The contribution is required should be used to carry out maintenance.

Question 4: Was is the foreseen timeline of the project?

Answer: Once the project design is approved, implementation may start in June or July.

Question 5: What is the actual number of boreholes drilled?

Answer: The number of boreholes to be drilled or rehabilitated is not yet known as the project is not yet approved and we are still collecting data.

Question 6: As a young person I am concerned about the number of unemployed youths in the communities; how will the youth be involved in the project? How many youths and employed?

Answer: The project will empower some youths in the maintenance works and rehabilitation work and monitoring.

Question 7: In the presentation is mentioning deforestation. The concern is that there is not enough fuel to boil water and cook and to do others tasks, how can the project help with this?

Answer: The answer comes from the Chipangli Forest officer who emphasized the importance of reducing deforestation, by planting more trees or finding alternative methods to cook and boil water.

During the second presentation, PNA Managing Director explained the Role of the Gold Standard and about carbon projects and the transfer of carbon rights. Climate change and its affects, carbon finance and the contributions of the project to sustainable development goals were discussed in this session. He introduced Gold Standard Foundation with the core principles and explained how the project will reduce GHG emissions to achieve certification. He explained that the carbon finance would be used to implement the project and management of monitoring activities, maintenance of boreholes and carrying out hygiene campaigns. The participants to the local stakeholder meeting are informed that an agreement would be signed with the representatives of the communities for transferring the ownership of the carbon credits to project implementers. In return, the project implementers commit to do the necessary expenditures to supply accessible and drinkable water to the people.

Then, the contribution of the project to each sustainable development goals clarified and the participants are asked to discuss the SDG contributions of the project in groups. A couple of questions were asked to trigger the discussion and share comments in groups. The following questions are received:

Question 8: Can the project help reduce deforestation by planting trees?

Answer: (Mrs Quaranta, OGS Project Manager): At the initial stage the project will be financed by OffGridsun and based on the amount recovered through the Carbon Credit generated, it is possible that in the future some money could be used for these purposes.

Question 9: A lady asked how the project will help with the empowerment of women

Answer: (PNA Managing Director) We know that the problem of water affects directly the woman who are the ones collecting water. By proving more boreholes and rehabilitating others they'll spend less time collecting water and they can focus on other activities.

Question 10: Is it possible to use a pump, a tank and a solar system instead of the Indian mark hand pump?

Answer (PNA Managing Director): The project will use the Indian Mark 2 pump. But we take this question as a suggestion for future improvement.

Question 11: My concern is that the Chipangali district has different chiefs, different areas, and different skills. With this project how do you divide the effort to ensure that farms and people will benefit from it as it will serve as many beneficiaries as possible?

Answer (Mrs Quaranta): This is our first project in this area. That's why the number of beneficiaries targeted to be reached is between 10/20 thousand and not the whole population of Chipangali district. We know that PNA has been working a lot in these areas. With their help and by consulting the council we will target the area to start with.

Then, the contribution of the project to each sustainable development goals clarified and then the participants are asked to discuss the SDG contributions of the project in groups. A couple of questions were asked to trigger the discussion and share comments in groups. Following comments have been received:

Comment 1:

We drink water from Shallow wells, streams and boreholes. Generally, it is not safe because we do not put chlorine to purify it.

Comment 2:

We do suffer from waterborne diseases, especially during the rainy season. Reduced diseases will be the health benefit provided by the project.

Comment 3:

Water from the borehole will be safe and will not need to be boiled and as a result, we will, not use so much firewood or charcoal to boil and kill germs. Time will be saved from boiling water as the water will be drawn from safe water points.

Comment 4:

Boreholes will be drilled closer to where people live so they'll walk short distances. The women will spend less time going to collect water and less people will get sick and spend time at the clinic.

Comment 5:

We do agree that deforestation is increasing and the causes of deforestation in our communities are:

- 1. indiscriminate cutting of trees due to farming*
- 2. cutting trees due to charcoal burning*
- 3. cutting trees for farming*

Comment 6:

The livelihoods of the community will be improved with the proposed project activity.

Comment 7:

The project will increase the income generation activities; it will lessen the time on the water collection; it will improve the health condition of the people. On the other hand, there will a cost of maintenance of the facility.

Comment 8:

The livelihood of the community will improve. We believe that the livelihood of the community will improve because of the project. The distance to the water point will be reduced and give more time for other tasks.

Comment 9:

The Positive side of the project is that it will reduce communicable diseases like diarrhea. It will lessen the distances to water points. There will be peace in marriages. Communities will be doing irrigation farming. On the other hand, human-animal conflict because of sharing same water point.

After the discussion, the meeting continued with safeguarding principles assessment and discussion of mitigation and monitoring plans. It is explained that the project will be implemented in line with all health and safety measures for workers. No additional comments are received from the participants.

The discussion is followed by the introduction of continuous input/ grievance mechanism options. The process book is decided to be placed in the local villages' chiefs' offices.

Before closing remarks, the participants were asked to fill down the evaluation forms. They were also informed that all project documents would be accessible on web and another feedback round would be run for two months as a part of the project

certification. It is also stated that all participants to the meeting would be informed about the start of the second feedback round.

Then the Chipangali Council chairperson thanked PNA and Offgridsun for organizing a wonderful meeting to address the water problems in the district. He further encouraged the people to guard jealously the boreholes when they are drilled or rehabilitated.

His Royal Highness Chief Mnukwa thanked all the people that come for the meeting and asked fellow chiefs to come up with area development plans in their respective chiefdoms to help their people as they allocate land for farming and for making villages. The chiefs should know where their people will get the water if they allocate land and also plan for different infrastructure developments like clinics, schools, shops and marketplaces. He also encouraged people to live in harmony despite coming from different chiefdoms.

Her Royal Highness Chieftainess Mkanka in her closing remarks thanked everyone for taking their time to come and be a part of this very important meeting. She expressed her hope that Chipangali will now be a better place with the coming of the safe water project and people's lives will be better, living conditions will improve. She gave an example that many years ago people used to draw water from shallow wells then later improved to closed wells and around 1990 there was another improvement with the coming of India Mark2 pump. She also said if soon we can see in our communities tap water like our friends that stay in town, then people's lives may change for the better.

Before the end of the meeting, the closing prayer was done by the Nthope ward Chairperson after which everyone stood for the national anthem.
