A non-technical summary of the project activity was made available to the stakeholders prior to the consultation meeting also in English and Swahili.

Protect the Environment, Use Clean Cookstoves

Tunza Mazingira, Tumia Jiko Banifu

Purpose of the Project Activity

OffgridSun Srl and Inuka Youth Development Organization will distribute improved cookstoves (ICS) to reduce the use of fuelwood or charcoal in rural Tanzania. The project aims at reaching a total number of 10,000 households living in Tanga Region, Handeni District, within 10 villages located in the wards Kwachaga, Mazingara and Mkata. The villages are Kwachaga, Tuliani, Mkomba, Mpalagwe, Mazingara, Amani, Suwa, West Mkata, East Mkata na Manga. By the implementation of the project, traditional stoves will be replaced with the project stoves that have higher efficiency and the fuelwood consumption and related carbon emissions will be lessened.

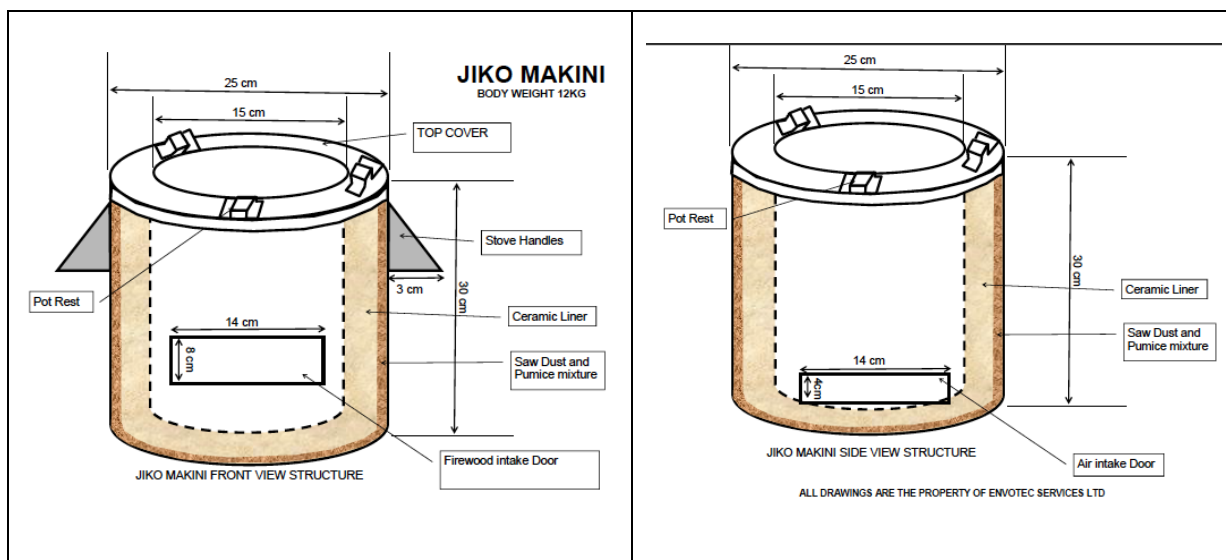
The national penetration of ICS in Tanzania is only 5% that is even lower in rural regions of the country. Lack of agents in rural remote areas, long distances and poor road conditions, lack of finance for the producers who are small scale artisans are among the reasons for the low penetration. In order to overcome those challenges, the proposed project will distribute/ install cookstoves in rural Tanzania. The cookstoves will be sold at a subsidized affordable price to facilitate the access of the poorest families. Sensitization campaigns on clean cooking, tree planting and environmental conservation will be also provided to the targeted communities. Local youth and women will be trained to become local agents to sell the cookstoves within the villages. The income will be used to finance the project management and to purchase more project stoves to scale up the intervention.

Technology

Jiko Makini stove is made of metal with a ceramic liner inside. There are two handles on two sides and a metal top cover for the pot rest. A layer of sawdust and pumice mixture between the ceramic liner and metal outer surface provides high thermal efficiency. There is firewood intake door in the front and air intake at the back of the stove. The stove can be used by both firewood and charcoal. Thermal efficiencies are given for both fuel types in table below.



Environmental	13 CLIMATE ACTION 	<p>Reduction of CO2 emissions:</p> <p>The project will distribute/install improved cookstoves with higher thermal efficiency, therefore; using less firewood. This will reduce GHGs emissions from cooking practices.</p>
	15 LIFE ON LAND 	<p>Reduced deforestation:</p> <p>Traditional cooking methods (three-stone fire) consumes high volumes of firewood that have been collected from nearby forestry areas in general. The project will have positive impact on forest degradation and deforestation by reducing the need for fuelwood collection and production in the region. Moreover, the project will foresee the distribution of little plants to the local population to sensitize them on the importance of tree planting.</p>
Social impacts	3 GOOD HEALTH AND WELL-BEING 	<p>Improved health conditions:</p> <p>Traditional cooking method produces a lot of smoke which may result in chronic respiratory diseases and hearth problems. Women generally spend 3-7 hours for cooking and exposed to air pollution more than the other members of the family. They may also suffer burns during cooking. Improved burning conditions with the project stoves will reduce indoor air pollution and lessen burns during cooking.</p>
	5 GENDER EQUALITY 	<p>Empowerment of women:</p> <p>Women and young girls have to walk long distances to fetch firewood in rural Tanzania. With less time spent on fuel wood collection, women will have more time available for leisure, education or opportunities for market employment that can raise their household status.</p> <p>The project’s approach also involves the engagement of groups of women living in the targeted rural areas as facilitators and local agents to reach the targeted end-users.</p>

		<p>Creating jobs:</p> <p>Production of stoves parts, distribution/installation, maintenance and marketing activities will create temporary and permanent job opportunities for local people. The employees will acquire new skills and knowledge through trainings provided as well.</p>
<p>Economic impacts</p>		<p>The household who purchases firewood will spend less money due to the reduced use. More income will be available for basic needs such as food, clothing, shelter as well as education.</p>

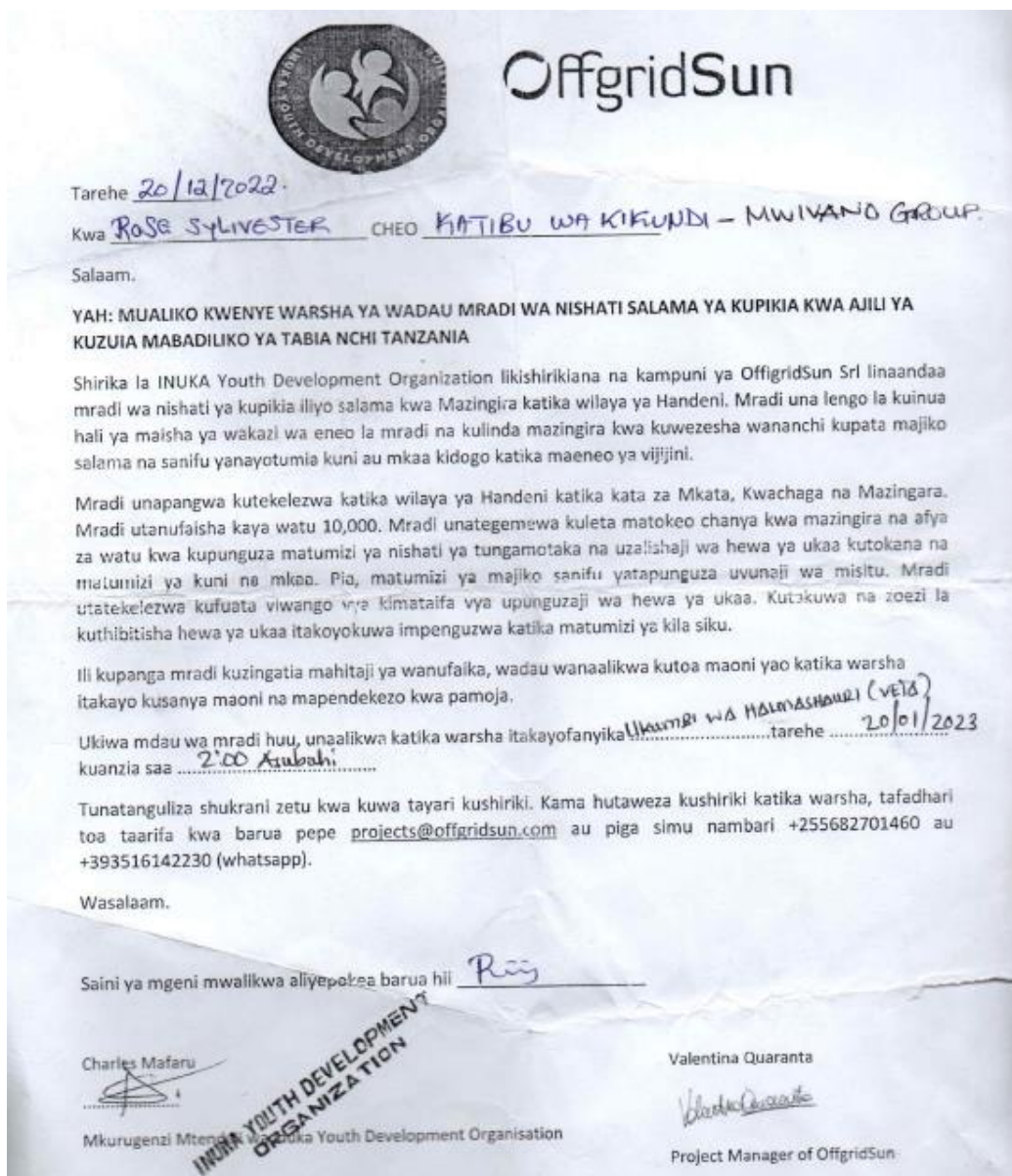

C.2. Minutes of physical meeting(s)

The meeting took place in Ukumbi Wa Babu Ali on 20th January 2023 and 56 participants attended.

The meeting opened by welcoming all participants and explaining the aim of the meeting by Charles Mafaru from Inuka Youth Development Group. Everyone in the meeting introduced himself/herself explaining their position and roles in the community. The representatives of the project partners also introduced themselves and their roles in the project shortly. The District officer representative who was the guest of honor then officially opened the meeting and presentations begun.

All presentations and discussions were interpreted in local language Swahili. The first presentation was done by Adams Omondi from OffgridSun who explained general and specific objectives of the project and introduced the Jiko Makini stove that uses both firewood and charcoal. He further gave details of project implementation including the villages that have selected and tentative schedule. Women and youth groups will be used as agents for the distribution of cookstoves. They will receive trainings about effects of climate change, how to distribute the cook stoves to the end users and how to effectively use the improved cook stove for better performance and increased life span. Education will also be done for residents of the target area to promote the use of improved cookstoves instead of traditional three stone fire. A short demonstration of the project stove is presented afterwards.

The second presenter, Valentina Quaranta from OffgridSun explained the positive impacts of the project including improved state of health due to less smoke, reduced deforestation and GHG emissions as less fuel would be used and savings on the money spent on fuel. She further presented the implementation plan for the project. The development of the project will be completed until June 2023. A baseline will be carried for data collection and the project documents will be prepared and submitted to Gold Standard afterwards. The project will also be registered to Vice-President Office of Tanzania. By July 2023; the production of the cookstoves, education and training of the distributors will start. The cookstoves are planned to be distributed and education to the community on the importance and benefits of using the improved cook stove will be done until December 2023. After the project stoves are distributed and become operational, the monitoring phase to follow up the use of stoves will begin. Data will be collected from beneficiary households on the performance of the stoves.

The following questions were asked from the public and the answers given by the presenters:

Question 1: Can the Jiko Makini cook stove sizes be adjusted since there are families with high population that need a bigger cook stove?

Answer: At the moment there is only one size available that has been tested and approved but maybe later after consultations between Offgridsun and Envotec, a bigger size can be manufactured and distributed.

Question 2: What will be the price of Jiko Makini?

Answer: Offgridsun intends to sell the improve cook stove at Tsh. 10,000 so that every household can be able to afford the cook stove.

Question 3: Can someone use both firewood and charcoal at the same time on Jiko Makini?

Answer: Only one fuel can be used at a time.

Question 4: What can be done to ensure that other households outside the target area benefit from Jiko Makini?

Answer: At the moment the project target area is within the said villages but based on outcomes, the project intervention area may be expanded depending on the results of this project.

The District Officer representative then emphasized on importance on ensuring that every household within the target area gets the improved cook stove and uses it so that the project area may be expanded and other areas also benefit.

Charles Mafaru from INUKA presented on the climate change, causes and effects after a short break. He briefly explained the causes of climate change including uses of fuels and cutting down the forest. He mentioned possible effects of climate change on the sea levels and water availability. Then, Valentina Quaranta from OffgridSun continued by explaining the role of the Gold Standard and how the project will reduce GHG emissions to achieve certification. She added that the carbon finance would be used for:

- Recovering the initial investment used in executing the project.
- Conducting project monitoring activities.
- Expanding the project to a wider geographic area and reach more people.

- Reducing the price of the improved cook stove significantly to ensure every household within the target area can afford.
- Conducting other development projects within the area that the project is being executed.

The participants to the local stakeholder meeting are informed that an agreement would be signed with the users for transferring the ownership of the carbon credits to project implementers. In return, the project implementers commit to do the necessary expenditures to produce and distribute cookstoves. Valentina then highlighted the cook stove agreement document issued when purchasing the cook stove. The agreement will include terms covering the following issues:

- Transfer of the carbon credit to the project developer.
- Each household is allowed to buy only one improved cook stove.
- Each household is to use the cook stove provided and not the traditional cook stove.
- Each household members should be willing to avail themselves and show the cook stove when the project developer needs to make periodic visits to confirm use of the cook stove.

The present stakeholders were then given another opportunity to asks questions:

Question 5: How are women who make cook stoves within the villages going to benefit from the project?

Answer: The project intends to use the existing women groups as promoters and distributors so as to create an environment of collaboration rather than competition.

Question 6: What happens when the cook stove is broken or stolen?

Answer: The cook stove may be replaced within the warranty period of one year if damaged cook stove cannot be used any more. Damages outside the warranty period will result to buying of a new cook stove. The damaged cook stove which are not operational will be retained by the project developer in return of the renewed stove. The cook stoves stolen will not be replaced for free and the buyer may buy a new one but without a discounted price. This is to avoid scenarios where one buys the cook stoves and sells them elsewhere and claims that the cook stove has been stolen.

Then, the contribution of the project to each sustainable development goals clarified and then the participants are asked to discuss the SDG contributions of the project in

groups. A couple of questions were asked to trigger the discussion and share comments in groups. Following comments have been received:

Comment 1:

The project will change the traditional cooking behaviors as follows: The project will enable cooking of large amounts of food using less fuels. There will be a reduced amount of money used in buying fuels hence help families save money.

There will be reduced amount of carbon emitted into the atmosphere and rate of forest and bush depletion. The health conditions will improve.

The time used in search of firewood will be reduced and women can get time to participate in other activities.

Comment 2:

The traditional smoke affects health adversely during cooking. Smoke causes constant lachrymation and eyes of individuals who are exposed to smoke become redder in color. Persistent coughs and respiratory problems are observed in people who are exposed to smoke continuously. This may lead to death in the long term. The project will reduce the amount of charcoal and firewood used and improve state of health of women who are constantly exposed to smoke while cooking. Households will save money that is used to buy large amounts of fuels. The project will save trees and improve the state of environment as well as prevent the climate change.

Comment 3:

Women may benefit from the project by saving time that is used in firewood collection and money used to buy firewood and charcoal. There will be reduced cases of sickness due to exposure to smoke. The women groups that will be involved in selling and distribution of cook stove will earn money from the sale of the cook stove.

Comment 4:

The project will change the use of charcoal and firewood and help save on the time used in firewood collection and cooking. The time used in cooking will be reduced as the project cook stove has reduced heat loss to the surrounding and most of the heat is directed to the food being cooked.

Comment 5:

The forests are being depleted at a high rate due to production of charcoal and timber for sale of construction of houses. Trees are cut to provide room for agriculture. The project will reduce the demand on charcoal and less trees will be cut.

Comment 6:

The project will help improve the livelihoods of the community as instead of using Tsh.1000 on buying charcoal for cooking a specific number of meals, one will use Tsh.500 for cooking the same number of meals.

There will also be reduction of carbon gas produced as smoke hence help conserve the environment and reduce cases of illness due to exposure to smoke.

There will be no negative impact of the project as the methodology used in execution of the project safeguards the interests of the environment and the community at large.

After the discussion, the meeting continued with safeguarding principles assessment and discussion of mitigation and monitoring plans. Adams Omondi from Offgridsun explained that the project will respect all the labour rights and will ensure that a favourable working condition is enabled. Those involved in distribution and selling of the cookstove will be trained and safety measures will be undertaken to prevent any injuries. He also explained that the project will have no negative impacts expected on the environment, in terms of air quality, water resources, biodiversity and forestry. An opportunity to ask questions was given to the audience but no one had a question.

The discussion is followed by the introduction of continuous input/ grievance mechanism options. The process book is decided to be placed in the local villages' chiefs' offices.

Before closing remarks, the participants were asked to fill down the evaluation forms. They were also informed that all project documents would be accessible on web and another feedback round would be run for two months as a part of the project certification. It is also stated that all participants to the meeting would be informed about the start of the second feedback round. Then, the stakeholders present were allowed to inspect the sample of Jiko Makini that was present at the meeting.
